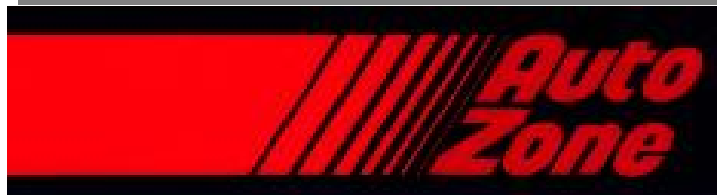
**Special Cruise
